



## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

### Being 'Born from Above' (John 3: 1-17)

I have a deep admiration for Nicodemus.

Sure, he comes to Jesus under the cover of darkness, seeking a private conversation. Maybe this has something to do with his standing in the Jewish community. Nicodemus is a leader among the Pharisees. People expect religious leaders to be in the know – especially when it comes to matters of God. Perhaps this secrecy reflects the loneliness of leadership. Perhaps it has something to do with his pride.

*But it is, at the very least, a pride or loneliness he is willing to fight.*

Nicodemus is not content to avoid his heart's questions. He has carefully observed Jesus and has come to his conclusion: 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' *Nicodemus believes Jesus is from God.* Even if his peers are closed to this possibility, Nicodemus is both *open* - and *willing to act*.

Jesus recognises Nicodemus as both intelligent and genuine. Rather than simply agreeing with his observations regarding his mission, Jesus responds with the provocative: 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.'

This is a deep and profound compliment: Nicodemus' observations of Jesus and his mission are far more than simply careful and accurate. They are the work of heaven. *Nicodemus' recognition of God's work in Jesus' mission reveal that something of heaven has been 'born' in him.*

Of course, this does not imply this Pharisee understands what is happening to him. Jesus' 'born from above' statement is also designed to throw this law teacher off balance.

*And, in this, Jesus is wildly successful.* If Nicodemus' came with his own agenda it is now history. He is drawn into Jesus' statement and for the remainder of the conversation this teacher and leader does nothing but listen and ask: 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' And later, 'How can these things be?'

Importantly, they are questions of one who is asking: 'What is God is doing in me?' In this conversation, Nicodemus – of all people – is found humble enough to play the role of disciple. He is a listener, a learner, a student. And God has, God is, opening his eyes. *This Pharisee is, miraculously, 'being born from above'.*

And as such, the teaching of Jesus is much less a rebuke of Nicodemus, than a gracious explaining of what God is doing.

## FROM ST JOHN'S CARE

On Thursday a young woman rang late in the afternoon asking if St John's Care could help her. She was desperate, she needed help with the registration of her car. She is a single Mum with five children, one child is disabled so the car is essential.

She had been to three other charities, but all had said that registration was not something they could help with. I asked her to bring in her registration renewal papers and her income statement and we would see how we could help her. It is strange, but I don't really see our service as a charity, I see us as a helpful, loving and caring organisation.

The young woman came in on Friday. She is thirty eight years old, and has five children, aged 17, 16, 15, 12 and 4. She can normally manage, just. But the last few weeks have been a disaster for her. School books, uniforms, the car had to have new tyres, the existing ones were bald, one of the kids got sick so there were some chemist bills as well.

Earlier in the year, she had a very personal crisis with one of her teenagers. To resolve the problem my Mum took out a loan from one of the loan firms. There was nothing else she could do. She needed the money, but this was the only way she could get it. No credit card, and no bank would lend her money. To repay \$500.00 she needs to pay \$80.00 per fortnight for the next thirteen fortnights. The total cost of the loan will be \$1,040.00. The money is automatically deducted from your Centrelink account so that you can't forfeit. These loan places are legal but they are a disaster and penalise those who can't afford it.

When she arrived, the Volunteers offered her a coffee. She wanted coffee but nothing to eat, she hadn't eaten for a couple of days, as the family were short of food. She felt it was more important for her to feed the children, but she was so agitated about the car that she could not eat.

We had a few hiccups with the correct paperwork, but finally, we were able to pay her registration for the next three months. As soon as we removed the stress from this young woman, her appetite immediately returned. Luckily we had the Community Friday Lunch, so she tucked into a lot of food.

We also helped the family with food, which means that they can use the food money to pay off that dreadful loan that my Mum took out with the loan sharks. I can understand why she did it, but it is having a real impact on the family.

I got a lot of hugs from this young woman, but the hugs were for you, not me. Thank you for your generosity, our fellow Canberrans appreciate it.

My wish list for this week: shampoo, tampons (we have plenty of pads), toothpaste and brushes for children.



### SARAH MACNEIL'S CONSECRATION AS BISHOP OF GRAFTON

In a memorable and historic service on March 1, The Reverend Dr. Sarah Macneil, until recently Senior Associate Priest at Holy Covenant, was consecrated as the 11th Bishop of Grafton and the first woman diocesan bishop in Australia. More than 20 members of the Holy Covenant community travelled to Grafton to attend the consecration service at the Cathedral of Christ the King. Sarah said next day she had felt rather like a gift, lovingly wrapped and packaged, now delivered to her new diocese.

Sarah was surrounded by friends and familiar faces at the consecration: four Holy Covenant representatives introducing her on her entry, Bishop Stuart Robinson leading the liturgy as Chief Consecrator, and Assistant Bishops Stephen Pickard and Kay Goldsworthy presenting her to the Chief Consecrator. Bishop Allan Ewing, an erstwhile minister at Holy Covenant, preached.

In his sermon, Bishop Ewing reflected on the coincidence of a new episcopate with the centenary of the Grafton diocese. In the same way that Grafton faced uncertainty in 1914, Sarah as a new bishop faced uncertainty now but should adopt grace, love and humility as her guiding principles. He drew on the words of a Bach cantata sung at the consecration service to remind the gathering that "We hasten with weak but eager steps, Jesus, Master, to come to help you".

In all, 19 bishops attended the ceremony, laying their hands on Sarah's head before Parish members presented her with the Holy Covenant gift of a pectoral cross. From General Synod representatives she received an Episcopal ring given by husband Ian. The female bishops clothed Sarah in her cope and mitre and representatives of the Canberra and Goulburn Diocese presented her with her Canberra-made Episcopal staff.

And then applause ... thunderous, warm and prolonged. No encore, but afterwards, a sausage sizzle in a welcome downpour and afternoon tea on the lawns of Sarah's new home overlooking the Clarence.

We give thanks for Nell's life and her presence among us – with her ready smile, gentle nature and sparkling blue eyes.



Parishes are to be congratulated for their preparation and prayerful execution of activities and programmes. Hundreds of '150<sup>th</sup>' New Testaments have been given away and many people have come to – or recommitted their lives to Christ. My 'walk' will conclude on Good Friday with an open air service in Belmore Park in Goulburn.


