SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

Reflection taken from John 5: 1-9

Jesus heals a man crippled of 38 years. The day when this happened was a Sabbath.

Remember and be re-membered.

(Note, the opposite of remember is not forget but dis-member)

Remember and be re-membered, be put back together, whole. Don't remember and gradually fall apart.

Remember: all that is, the universe in its terrible splendour, is held together in the Logos (Word) of God. This Logos was emptied out into the form of a human, child of Mary, Son of God. The agency of God's creativity is the same in redemption. It is Jesus the Logos.

Remember and be re-membered. In the bread and the wine lifted up we see God's unconditional love for the healing of the whole of all things. "Do this – remember – and be re-membered".


Remember (the Sabbath) and be re-membered. (The 4th Commandment)

God is present to all humanity and the whole of creation through His rest in Sabbath. Sabbath is not just the fulfilment of creation, it is the completion of redemption. The death and resurrection of Jesus is for the whole of creation. The language of resurrection is not for the edification of an individual's private faith but the transformation of all that is. Sing Hallelujah! What point is faith if we are afraid to embrace what Jesus surrendered everything for? When we practice Sabbath rest, we are open to the embrace of the Lord of the Sabbath. We will find a wholeness that turns us towards the world around us. We are not 'blessed' but become a blessing for others. We will be found in gentle solidarity with the world and its needs, not fleeing from it. We will be found in a gracious, joyful, engagement in a life fully lived. Remembering Sabbath is to rest in the grace of God who delights in this world he has made.

Remember and be re-membered. Be renewed and made whole. Not in order to be removed from the fears and realities of the world, but called into the fulfilment of the human vocation: the embrace of the world in which God is pleased to be fully present.

Problem Gambling in the ACT

I was very interested this week to read the findings of a new report from the ANU Centre for Gambling Research into gambling in the ACT that shows that the proportion of people gambling fell around 15% while gambling expenditure in the ACT fell by 19% over the 5 years 2009 – 2014. However, the report found the prevalence of severe problem gambling was similar over the past five years and many of the social and economic harms and problems linked to gambling have not improved.

Until recently I had been working closely with a person who was dealing with a range of family and personal issues. I knew this person for some time before it became evident that he had a severe gambling problem.

Initially, he presented seeking food support and some assistance getting some identification documentation. I worked pretty intensively with him for a couple of weeks on a range of issues as we waited for his next pension payment to arrive. He came in on the Monday after his pension was paid with news that as a result of getting some very bad family news, he had gambled away his entire fortnight's pension. I continued to provide some ongoing support as we once again waited for his next pension payment, when he could get some food with his own money. However, further bad news led to a repetition of him gambling away his entire pension on the day he received it. I continued to provide some support to him for a time after which he decided that he no longer needed any further assistance and I haven't seen him since. I hope and pray that all is going well for him.

My thinking about problem gambling was sparked by an incident that happened to me when I attended the Brumbies game on Sunday. Upon my arrival inside GIO Stadium, I was accosted by someone in high visibility gear offering to give me \$5 for free to use on the TAB. I refused and as I proceeded towards my seat, I was approached a second time, which I also refused. It does concern me that those who benefit from gambling are working so hard to normalise betting and especially in relation to high profile sports such as rugby, league and AFL. I recently read that football fans watching round one of the AFL on TV this year were bombarded with gambling advertising, with more than one in six ads promoting gaming. I also note that TAB.com.au is a sponsor of GIO Stadium and that TAB is a sponsor of the Brumbies.

Of particular concern to me is that at a family event such as the football, young people and children are exposed to gambling to such an extent that they begin to accept it as normal.

PARISH COUNCILLOR PROFILE

This week we interviewed **Nic Platt**, one of our Wardens.

What nourishes you? Life itself, especially my family whom I always put first. People are a constant source of wonder, whether they behave wonderfully or violently... I read almost constantly. I especially like philosophy and theologically focused material and I'm mentoring EfM which gives me the opportunity to constantly review the stories on which our tradition is based... Music I am finding perhaps the purest form of expression, joy. But certainly the arts have always been a primary focus.

What are your passions? Life, death and what lies in between and beyond them. The beauty in the world. The natural order of things in the broader reality...ours and my place in it. The profound meaning of our existence and our *raison d'etre*.

What do you see as your role on parish council? I am a warden. In conjunction with two others I jointly shoulder various responsibilities which ensure the smooth and legal functioning of the Holy Covenant parish. In the light of recent events at Holy Covenant, a sense of strong and consistent leadership has been called for to carry forward into and through the interregnum. I am not alone, but part of an effective team.

Parish Council News...

- Reports were received from Parish Groups - these, including the Youth Group under its new leadership, are functioning well
- An individual member of Parish Council will in future attend meetings of each of the Parish Groups that report to Council, to provide direct links between those groups and the Council
- Members of PC will give particular attention to welcoming newcomers at services, both generally and on a rostered basis
- Offerings are below budget, but so are expenditures during the present period without a long term Rector
- The list of persons holding Working With Vulnerable People cards is being updated to ensure status is current . Similarly for those persons requiring Safe Ministry training or to complete a refresher course (next training is 28/29 May at Holy Covenant)
- We are still seeking a Pastoral Care Coordinator (Nic Platt is acting in the role)
- Office arrangements are being explored to accommodate youth workers, other users, storage of equipment etc, and coordination of an asset register is to take place
- Experience was shared on offering shelter to the homeless, but this is not currently on the agenda of the parish
- A report from the Communications Committee was discussed; steps will be taken to update the hard copy parish roll that is available to members of the parish, and to ensure that people know where to make contact for support or a pastoral visit.
- **Traffic calming is being investigated for the (shared-use) car park**
- Holy Covenant will participate, later in 2016 in the next (five-yearly) National Church Life Survey.



Tikondane aims to:

1. Reduce poverty in the province of Katete, with particular regard to the women of the community
2. Address local health issues through education and the creation of a network of CTC (Counselling-Testing-Care) centres for HIV/AIDS within the eastern Zambian catchment of villages
3. Create income-generating activities and on-the-job skill training for community members
4. Provide formal qualifications for community members, ranging from basic schooling to providing funding for higher education needs
5. Support the growing number of HIV orphans in the region and provide them with basic living requirements, an education and work skills.
