## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

### Luke 8: 26-39. Befriending our demons

In writing these reflections, I am again struck by how rich these gospel narratives are. These are no mere 'factual' reports, but crafted, richly-layered narratives. For example, it is surely no accident that the story of Jesus' calming the external storm on the Sea of Galilee (Luke 8: 22-25) is followed by the account of his calming the inner storm of the man afflicted by demons.

The poetic resonance conveyed by the juxtaposition of these two stories is also enhanced through details in the setting. Luke tells us that Jesus has suggested to his disciples that they should 'go across to the other side of the lake'. This would take them into gentile territory into the country of the Gerasenes. As if this had not been enough to take them out of their comfort zone, the disciples are then confronted by a naked man who is described as 'having demons', who lives in tombs instead of a house, and who needs to be restrained and kept under guard. This is a crash course in meeting people at the margins!

In the previous reflections I have been talking about seeing as Jesus sees. In today's story however, we are told that it is the man who sees Jesus approaching: 'What do you want with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, don't torture me. It is interesting that the 'demons' also recognise Jesus. But what is this about being tortured?

This week I went to see a moving film called *the Man Who Knew Infinity* in which a Hindu mathematical genius challenges GW Hardy, the Cambridge mathematics professor and atheist: 'It's not that you don't believe in God. It's rather that you don't think God likes you very much.' Even believers can be haunted by an image of a God who doesn't like them very much. Although this is not consciously expressed, they can be like Gloucester in Shakespeare's *King Lear* for whom the gods become demonic. He says in his suffering: 'As flies to wanton boys are we to the gods. They use us for their sport.' Obviously this is not the God we see in Jesus.

The modern approach to psychological and spiritual healing and transformation is less about casting out demons than befriending them, getting acquainted with them, and thereby transforming them. (Here I am using 'demons' as a metaphor for those disowned parts that seem to turn against us.) CG Jung says of the Shadow (the realm where 'demons' lurk) that it is 90% pure gold – eminently redeemable with God's help! So let us refuse to demonise each other, ourselves, or God. Instead, as Kayla McClurg suggests, let us see people 'not as caricatures but as unique icons of God's image.' Admittedly, sometimes some restoration work is needed.

You may be aware that I write my weekly edition on the Wednesday before it is, amongst other things, published in the pew sheet at St John's Anglican Church, Reid for the following Sunday.

This Sunday we will be formally celebrating the 25th anniversary of the launch of St John's Care at the 9.30am service and I will be giving the address.

I am looking forward to looking down into the congregation and seeing people who were there at the beginning and who have continued to serve through St John's Care for the entire 25 years. I look forward to seeing people who have volunteered in the Emergency Relief Centre and Breakfast Club or on the Committee, some for many years. I look forward to seeing a group of people who, after 25 years, are still as committed to the mission as when it began. I also look forward to seeing people from other congregations and other organisations who have joined us in the journey.

I intend saying firstly CONGRATULATIONS! 25 years of amazing dedication of those that have gone before and those who continue to share the love with each other and with so many in our community who are doing it tough.

Today (Tuesday), I have been sitting in day one of a two-day Mental Health First Aid workshop and have been reminded about the significant number of people in our community who suffer with depression or anxiety or experience psychosis, the effects of alcohol and other drug abuse, self-harm or have suicidal thoughts. I suspect that everyone reading this will know someone who is suffering with mental ill health.

We see and help these people every day. Not only do many come seeking emergency help, some come on a regular basis and have been coming for years, whilst others know they can come when they need to.

I also plan to say something about why I believe that St John's Care is at the cutting edge of what it is to be Church and that it is Church and indeed community, at its very best.

I was told recently that we have a wonderful reputation amongst the female inmates at Alexander Maconochie Centre not only for helping, but for "being really nice people" as well. I am just so grateful for the opportunity to have been a part of St John's Care for nearly a year now, as it continues to minister to those in need.

### Work Health and Safety at Holy Covenant

The *Holy Covenant Anglican Church Jamison Work Health and Safety Policy* was signed off by the Rector and Wardens in December 2015. Endorsement of the Policy heralds the end of a significant body of work occurring over the past four years.

The Policy reflects Parish responsibilities to deliver a safe working and participation environment for members of the congregation, workers and those who attend other activities held on the grounds.

The policy framework is based on Australian Capital Territory (ACT) legislative framework as set out in the following legislation:

1. *Working with Vulnerable People (Background Checking Regulation 2012)*; and
2. *Work Health and Safety Act 2011*.

The document also reflects the work and guidelines as produced by the Anglican Diocese of Canberra and Goulburn.


