SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

Luke 21: 5-19

Can desolation be any more complete than not one stone resting upon another?

What would it be like to be held on Nauru with no reason and no end?

Watching the documentary *Chasing Asylum* recently was distressing. My son Matt asked 'why would people sew their lips together? Why?' I tried to answer: 'it is a sign of distress and complete powerlessness maybe – when the only power one can exert is over your own body'. It looks like a place of despair.

I find it hard to make sense of Jesus' talk of the end times. Of course, it is a clear biblical principle that we live with the future in mind; in the light of our past we choose and act now for a future worth hoping for. But what might that actually look like?

There is a tiny story that precedes today's Gospel.

As Jesus looked up, he saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. "Truly I tell you," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on." (Luke 21.3-4)

Is it too rude to say it is so much easier for those beggar types to be generous! If you don't have anything other than what you have just begged, of course it is possible to give everything! But here is a dangerous proposition: what is it like to trust God? To actually, truly trust God, right in the midst of emptiness?

O God, let us never stand apart from those in despair, loneliness, desolation, need. You are our healing: let us trust and not be afraid; for you are our strength and song: you are our salvation.

The World of Disability

It is amazing how quickly time flies. I have now been here long enough to have started doing some things for a second time.

On Monday night, it was my privilege to attend my second National Disability Awards at Parliament House. The aim of the awards is to honour and recognise the outstanding achievements of individuals and organisations that have improved the lives of people with disability thereby contributed to increased recognition of equality and human rights for all Australians. The night was MC'd by Jonathon Welch, the founding Artistic director of The Choir of Hard Knocks. Some of you may remember the ABC TV documentary series which followed the early days of the Choir, established as a choir of homeless and disadvantaged people. This year they are celebrating their 10th anniversary. It is as innovative now as it was then: - "the ongoing and regular contact the choir provides to the members has had a profound effect on their lives, leading many of the original 52 back to either part time or full time study or work. The choir has also given members the opportunity to find new purpose in life. Many had become socially excluded due to their socio- economic circumstances, and the choir has enabled them to acquire new skills and rebuild personal confidence and self-esteem." It was my great pleasure to have a chat and get a selfie with him!

We were also entertained by blind Australian singer/songwriter guitarist Lorin Nicholson and the star of the recent Paralympics TV "Yes I Can" ads, Toni Dee.

The world celebrates International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD) on 3 December every year. IDPwD is a United Nations sanctioned day that is celebrated internationally. It aims to increase public awareness, understanding and acceptance of people with disability and celebrate the achievements and contributions of people with disability. The Australian Network on Disability estimates that some 4 million people (20% of the population) in Australia have some form of disability.

We must always remember that people with disability have the same basic human rights as other members of Australian society including the right to have their specific needs met. At St John's Care we welcome all that come to us with respect and compassion and prefer to think of people in terms of their abilities and strengths than any disability they may have.

FROM OUR RECTOR ...

Greetings everyone,

thank you all for the warm welcome I have received this week - it has been lovely getting to know some of you, and I look forward to meeting you all.

I especially thank the wardens, Merri, Kathryn and Nic for their wisdom, guidance and helpfulness over the last few weeks. I think these faithful people have carried much of the 'background stuff' over the last year - I hope they can rest a little now.

I was heartened that Bishop Trevor said at the induction that I'm employed to talk, because that's something I do well. However I thought I'd give you a little background about me so I don't have to repeat the story so many times!

I was born in Sydney but within weeks started living a pretty gypsy life as my dad was a bank manager. After many moves we settled in back in Sydney and I did most of my high school there before I moved to Canberra in 1976 to attend ANU. I didn't complete a degree but did meet my future husband, Robert, and we were married in 1980. Three children and another round of gypsy life, when we moved back to Canberra in the late 1980s I declared I wasn't moving again until the last child had finished school.

I tried being a stay at home mum but I needed more challenge (I can't think why now!) and so I took part time work that fitted into school hours. I have been a parliamentary guide, canteen manager and parish administrator before I was ordained in 2007 and started at St John's Reid in early 2008. (My youngest finished school in 2006.)

What was to be a two year curacy turned into a six year appointment. Robert died suddenly during my first year there and the good folk held me in prayer, fed me and helped me through the shock and grief. They are much of the reason I am still in ministry.

In 2013 I moved to Crookwell and has three very happy years with the amazing saints of God there. Even though I had lived in country towns during my childhood it was a completely different experience as an adult (and the local vicar). The local church's place in the community is very different to a suburban parish.

I am blessed to be the mother of three beautiful adults of whom I'm extremely proud. The four grandchildren are the joy of my heart and it is so lucky they are all in Canberra. I live in my own home in Kambah with Chaucer, the standard poodle you will meet occasionally, and Farthing, the cat who will stay at home and enjoy the dog-less peace and quiet.

In the next couple of weeks I'm going to check out some good places for coffee and hope to have the chance to get to meet you. Please don't think I'm too busy - invite me to your favourite haunt for a cuppa and a chat.

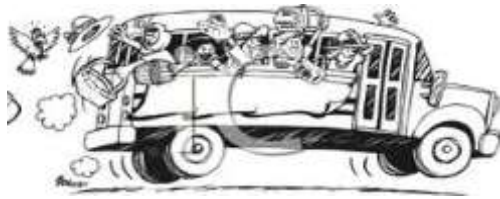
ORDINATION IN GOULBURN CATHEDRAL
