



## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

**Come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.**

(Isaiah 2.5)

The weapons of war turned into tools of agriculture? What a remarkable image. What a profound hope. What a provocative political agenda: training for peace; always peace, no more war.

So, hundreds of years after God's dreaming as recorded in Isaiah 2, what difference does Christ make?

Building on last week's reflection I borrow again from Sarah Bachelard a tiny preposition: *from*, rather than *at*. Looking *from* the resurrection rather than *at* it changes everything. That is, *from* the resurrection, there is no life, no death, no height nor depth, not time (present or future), angels or demons or anything in the whole of creation that can block us from God's love. Looking *from* the resurrection affirms, there is no line between male female, slave free, insider outsider, us them. Looking from the resurrection changes everything, and all is redeemable, even death, even evil.

I have been annoyed for a very long time reading the parable of the Good Samaritan. When love is what is demanded, the lawyer, knowing this, pursues Jesus the teacher for a loop hole with the question: 'who is my neighbour?' But Jesus never answers this question. Crickey this has annoyed me. But now I may be nearer to why. The story we call the good Samaritan makes it plain: it is the wrong question! There is no line marking in and out, us them. From the resurrection, can't you see, EVERYONE is neighbour. The question is not 'who' but how: 'how do we live'. And the story Jesus tells makes it plain: copy the outsider, the foreigner who we are trained to despise (the Samaritan), copy this one! See from the resurrection, all is one. Copy this outsider – who is Jesus – and there already, we are being trained into peace making not war mongering.

**He will teach us his ways ... so that we may walk in his paths ... nations ... they will beat their swords into plowshares ...and their spears into pruning hooks ... Nation will not take up sword against nation ... nor will they train for war anymore ... come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!**

## It's Advent – a Time of Preparation

This Sunday is the start of Advent in the Church's calendar. It is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of Christmas.

We at St John's Care are already busy in our preparations for our Christmas programs: our Present Room, Christmas Hampers and lunch on Christmas Day. I quite like the following which I found on the Common Grace website:

“Most of us long to be present in the moment at Christmas time. We want to be able to think deeply about the meaning of Christmas. We want to be able to pull back a bit from the craziness of attending parties and buying gifts and gathering with loved ones and take time for gratitude. We want to find enough head-space and heart-space to include those who find Christmas lonely and difficult at our tables and in our budgets.”

The recently released Roy Morgan poll states that “about half a million Australian children will likely wake up on Christmas morning without any presents as the financial burden of the season weighs on families.”

Our Present Room aims to address this on a local level. Families that are doing it tough can come and choose a present for each of their children along with some “stocking fillers” and a book. The Room is open from 6<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup> December from 9.30am – 2pm Monday to Friday.

Last year we were able to provide over 600 major presents and we expect to be able to do the same this year. Families will also receive a hamper of Christmas goodies, either donated by Belconnen Rotary or made up from goods donated to us.

This week I ask you to consider donating a present for the **Present Room**. It can be for a boy or a girl aged up to 18 years. Gift cards from stores such as EB Games, Rebel Sport and JB Hi-Fi are a good choice for teenage children who can otherwise be particularly hard to buy for. This is the age group we need most help with. However, I understand that demand for iTunes and Google Play cards is quite low. Books, games and puzzles would also be helpful.

Presents can be dropped off at St John's Care from 9.30am – 2pm Monday to Friday. We ask that the presents not be wrapped, as we prefer to offer our clients the opportunity to select presents appropriate for their children.

Dear friends,

I know that in Advent we spend lots of time telling you to slow down and not think of Christmas yet, but to enjoy the waiting, however.....

I'm going to write a little today about Christmas – the Christmas service times.

If there is any time when we should come together as one big family and celebrate together, it's Christmas. I've been looking at the service register and noticed the trends happening to numbers at Christmas and so this year I have proposed to the Wardens that we change the Christmas service times.

It seems that less and less people have been coming to the (midnight) 11 pm service, and between 90-100 to each of the morning services. The midnight service has been fairly traditional, as has the 8 am Christmas morning, with the expectations that families will come to 10 am.

Do you remember what time you all got up at Christmas when you were a child? What time do your children and grandchildren get up? How busy it was to get to Grandmas in time for lunch? 10 am for church is not the best time. And I'm also guessing that some of you who used to attend at 11 pm are finding that hard as well, and swapping to 8 am.



This year we will try **Christmas@9**.




## WANT TO KNOW WHAT MAKES US TICK?


