SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

Dear friends,

One of the advantages of wearing a clergy collar is that people expect you to talk about God. I have been a part of some amazing impromptu conversations. One that I remember started with the question 'do you believe in miracles?'

Christmas is a good time to ask yourself that question, because the most amazing miracle of all time is that the creator of the universe, whom we call God, chose to become a part of this world that he had made. By being born a defenceless baby to a young woman whose man initially thought he should end their engagement because she became pregnant. By living in an occupied country with a despotic ruler who reacted to news of the baby's birth by killing all baby boys in the region, so that he should not survive. By fleeing, as refugees, and taken in by others until it was safe for them to return to their country.

That is, of course, the story of Christmas. But in a library of 66 books, called the bible, that story only takes up two chapters in two books. It is the answer to the *how?* of the story of God's love.

To understand the *why?* of the story* you need to read the Hebrew Scriptures (which we sometimes call the Old Testament) which tell the journey leading up to God becoming one in the world. The Christian Scriptures (which we sometimes call the New Testament) tell the what? – what happened next. We are the living story of what is still happening today.

Jesus is called Immanuel, which means God is with us. And all through the time that Jesus was with us he lived with conflict, condemnation, injustice, discrimination. Jesus demonstrated how to live in peace, mercy, justice, compassion and love. John Bell, of the Iona Community, says of Jesus:

Light looked down and saw darkness.

"I will go there," said light.

Peace looked down and saw war.

"I will go there," said peace.

Love looked down and saw hatred.

"I will go there," said love.

WITHIN THE PARISH

FROM PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Council held its last meeting for 2016 on Tuesday evening, over a meal together.



- The next PC meeting will be on Tuesday 31 January, when new members of PC for 2017 will be invited to participate.
- The date for the AGM in 2017 has been set for Tuesday 21 February, 7.30pm.
 The Rector will appoint three members of the PC at the AGM (or up to a month after it).
- The Treasurer reported that we are on track financially and will complete the year with revenue slightly above target.
- Consideration was given to a draft budget for 2017, which will be refined further before the AGM, and to priorities that may be implemented for major maintenance, minor works and equipment - such as a new projector and screen (already approved in principle), new technology and Rainbow Centre modifications to support children's and youth activities, and new storage for the vestry. Action is being taken to upgrade security for the Rainbow Centre.
- The Rector spoke of her intention to strengthen children's and youth ministry; this will be an important aspect of strategic planning and related stewardship in mid 2017. She is also going to set up a Facebook community information page for Holy Covenant.
- An update will be sought in the first three months of 2017 for information to go into three parish publications (Information Booklet, Directory, and Roll) together with formal permission for personal information to be used in various contexts.
- Reports were received with thanks from the various ministry teams. Most are running smoothly but future Covenant Care funding is uncertain and a submission is being made to the Government.
- Parish Council considers that the parish is ending the year on a very good footing, and looks forward to 2017 with both hope and confidence.

EDUCATION FOR MINISTRY IN 2017


