You may like to light a candle in the **CHAPEL** at the back of the Worship Centre following communion.

**TOILETS** are found through the door past the kitchen. A baby change area is located in the Disabled toilet. Please take all used nappies with you.

### ELECTIONS FOR LAY MEMBERS OF SYNOD AND ALTERNATES AND LAY MEMBERS OF THE CLERGY APPOINTMENT BOARD

(2017-2019 inclusive)

Nominations are called for the following positions:

**Lay Members of Synod (3 positions):** These appointments are for three years and the principal duty is to attend the Diocesan Synod and related meetings.

**Alternate Lay Members of Synod (up to 3 positions):** While it is expected that Lay Members of Synod will see their attendance at Synod as a priority, provision is made for one or more Alternates to be available in cases of illness, etc. These appointments are also for three years.

**Parish members of the Clergy Appointment Board (3 positions):** These appointments are for three years. The principal duty of these positions is to be involved in the process of appointing a new Rector to the Parish if this should be required during the period.

A nomination form is available covering all positions. This must be signed by the Nominator, a Seconder and the Nominee. Please put completed nomination forms in the box provided.

Nominations will be received up until the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday 21 February 2017.

## SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

### Matthew 5:21-26

When I read the account of the Sermon on the Mount and listen to the sermons preached on it I am even more grounded in the fact that all that Jesus taught and did was about **love**. If we do not have love we do not have the way of living a right and good Christian life necessary to receive the Kingdom of Heaven. I also think that sometimes it's good to read all the Ten Commandments occasionally to get a bigger picture of what this love is. The Christian church liturgy has encompassed *all of the Ten Commandments into the Two Great Commandments 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your mind and with all your strength and your neighbour as yourself.'* and sometimes we need to remind ourselves of the background of those two commandments.

Today's gospel tells us that we shall not murder or even think about it and if we do have anything against our brother or sister then we need to lay it before God and go and deal with it.

Easier said than done?

I had an experience just recently where I had a profound 'God experience' that led me to contact a person who had a conflict with me nearly 20 years ago and it has sat with me all that time. My profound 'God experience' led me to meet with this person and ask their forgiveness even though I felt I had done nothing to create the conflict, I felt the fault line was not running from me. The meeting brought about a 'weight' off both our shoulders, a time of prayer together and a reuniting of our relationship. I can recommend it, this laying a cause before God and then, hand in hand with him, deal with the matter. It's far better than anger, or name calling or being burdened by a situation that we know is stopping us living a full life. Theologian Tom Write says. 'Every time you decide to let your anger smoulder on inside you, you become a little less than fully human. You are deciding to belittle yourself.' So what's the alternative? Jesus says there are two ways to deal with this before it gets out of hand: Be reconciled: make friends. How simple is that yet how hugely difficult as it will mean you will have to climb down off the pedestal you have put yourself on. Impossible you might say. Well it took me 20 years before it happened so no, it's not impossible and in God's strength all things are possible.

There is a verse in Colossians which jumped out at me yesterday from the calendar of Bible verses on my desk. It reads (Colossians 3:17)

*And whatever you do,  
whether in word, or deed,  
do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus,  
giving thanks to God the Father through him.*


Think on these things and look forward to the blessings they bring.

Some points from the meeting are:


- The parish budget for 2017 was approved for presentation to the AGM.

# I CAN'T WAIT TO TELL YOU...

that on a large notice board at the back of the church there is a display of the work of the HCN ministry. I think you will be amazed at what we are doing in this ministry that reaches out into our community with the love of Christ.



As one example of this love you may recall that from time I have asked for material and wool for a client who is housebound and very socially isolated due to a debilitating illness. One of her gifts is sewing and rather than sit in a black hole reflecting on what life has delivered to her she uses her gifts to help others.

With our support of providing her with the items YOU have donated she is making beautiful smocks, jackets and blankets for premature babies in hospital, beautiful angel gowns for deceased newborn babies and head coverings for people on chemotherapy. Her work is done with great love.

She also made for us to use in the Christmas Child boxes, lovely colourful library bags which I gave to a neighbouring church that has that ministry. She also made lovely small bags at Christmas for us to fill with chocolates and give to other clients and our Covenant Care volunteers and scented heat packs for clients who suffer pain.

All of this she says is a way of following our example of helping others. When we discovered this lady in the community via a community agency who asked us if we could help her, she was depressed, lonely and so isolated.

Now, though she still struggles with day to day living, she channels her gifts, which we helped her to discover, into helping others. We have brought friendship to her home and you know, just through this friendship and encouragement and befriending she has found Christ, reunited with her estranged family and has purpose in her life. This is one story of many who the HCN ministry and this congregation are helping to nurse back into life. God blesses this ministry in so many ways and those he puts in our path.



## Modern Communication (and the lack of it)

How easy is it to communicate with people these days! You can ring from home or the mobile or skype or message people on the smartphone or computer. I can even talk to my kids overseas in real time.

I remember when mobile phones first came in to use. I was on a chairlift in the snow and saw someone pull off to the side of the piste to talk on what was a comparatively large mobile phone. I couldn't believe why anyone would want to have a phone on the snow? Now of course, nearly everyone has one, even on the snow.

I wonder if you can imagine what it might be like not to have access to a mobile phone, a landline phone or the internet at home. How would you communicate with the world? Many of our clients struggle to maintain access to these tools of communication but some are just unable to do so. I currently have a number of clients who do not have access to a phone or the internet at home.

It makes it very difficult for these people to organise their lives and when they have serious issues which require regular and often urgent attention, it makes it even more difficult.

Imagine you have a mental illness which impacts on how you see the world and how you communicate with it. You might also suffer from a range of physical ailments that need regular medical attention. Imagine also that this combination of complex issues brings you into regular conflict with the system.

The only time we can communicate with clients like this, is when they come to the office, which they can only do from time to time. This means that when we do meet, a longer than normal appointment is required. It also means that implementing plans is very slow, which also often doesn't fit into the fast-paced requirements of the modern world. If things change in between visits or appointments have to be changed, it is just not possible to communicate this, often causing greater frustration for all parties.

We do have access to the Telstra voucher program which often enables us to assist people stay connected. With one particular client struggling with the above issues, we purchased a cheap mobile phone to assist her. I thought this was a great solution. However, for some reason, she is unable to get a signal in or around her house, so this is a work in progress.

The inability to have real time communication adds to the other difficulties and disadvantage that some of our clients experience. For most of us, we just take these communications tools for granted, but do spare a thought for those that do not have access to them.
