Luke 19:28-40

I love remembering the stones that line the path Jesus walked to Jerusalem. I remember my three visits to Israel when I walked down the same road, noticing the stones that lined the way, the various ancient stations of the cross and the view of Jerusalem in the distance. All made more poignant by the presence of a man with his donkey, offering a ride down the road. Here at this place, I remembered Jesus and his journey to Jerusalem; not only his journey to die, but a journey of freedom for us.

I remember the excitement of Palm Sunday as a child: the preparation for the day as well as the day itself. The day before we would go

with the adults to gather big palm branches from a parishioner's yard and 'dress' the church with them—over door ways, against the pulpit and the lecterns. Taking the smaller fronds from some of the

branches we would spend the rest of the day making palm crosses. On Palm Sunday itself we would parade through the street carrying palm branches and shouting hosanna (literally, 'Save! Now!') and gather at the church to hear the story of the Lord's passion and share in the Lord's supper. To this day I still have a palm cross from then in my prayer book and when I see it, again I remember. But more to be remembered is the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus for us. To make the journey down that road to Jerusalem knowing he was to die, that this was one of his last days on earth. He was surrounded by a

crowd cheering him on, waving palm branches, shouting their hosanna's, 'save now', thinking he was going to save them as a

conquering king.

As you receive the bread and wine at communion today, as you hear the Palm Sunday stories remember Hosanna – God saves.

BEST BIRTHDAY PARTY EVER!!

Two weeks ago, when K came to St John's Care, she explained that she had been experiencing a tough time recently. She was very concerned about not being able to celebrate her twins' upcoming 8th birthday.

She said that they had recently moved into a onebedroom apartment provided by public housing, and she was so grateful to have a place for herself and her children. K is a single mother and was in an abusive relationship for many years.

K said that the first time that she experienced domestic violence was when she was pregnant with her twins. K didn't leave because she thought he would change, and she wanted her kids to know their father. She explained that she decided to break the cycle of abuse one year ago when one of her twins said... "we want to see you happy, we want to be happy." K also talked about how hard it has been moving around to many different temporary homes (crisis accommodation for women with children). In total they have been in nine different locations within twelve months.

K wept as she told me her story. She said she is trying to do the best she can for herself and her children. She spoke of offering a better future for her twins, providing them with a safe and healthy environment to help them overcome the trauma from the past years of domestic violence. She said her wish was to organise a nice birthday party for her twins; complete with colourful balloons, nice presents, lots of candies and a delicious chocolate mud cake.

SJC immediately 'came to the party' and supported K with food for her family, food vouchers and a Chocolate Mud cake. We also provided her with cosy blankets and bedding, kitchen utensils and winter clothes. We put together a birthday party package which included balloons, candles, a tablecloth, birthday banner and birthday cake topper.

We also provided a lot of snacks for the twins. K was able to choose gifts that were left over from Christmas. SJC keeps a supply of these for this reason.

K was shocked when she saw the number of items we had for her and could not believe the generosity of the community. She told us that this year will be the best party her twins will have ever had! K broke down in tears because she could not believe how generous people could be. She was immensely thankful to all SJC's donors, volunteers, and staff.

K is one of the many clients who we receive daily. She left the Centre that day in a much happier place and walked away saying that she'll keep working hard towards their future. She said that she would one day like to be able to give back to assist others and help them as she has been.


