A week after Easter. A week after the joy, festivities, excitement, and chocolate. We believers in 2022, know Mary Magdalene's words to be true "I have seen the Lord!" And we celebrate with her.

Unfortunately the disciples, locked up in their fear, don't have the same trust in Mary's words. They needed to see Jesus, and his hands and sides, to believe he was alive.

I wonder where Thomas was, getting food? Locked up elsewhere, scared? He missed it, missed the visit from Christ. Missed the joy and the peace

and the foretaste of Pentecost. He wanted what the others had asked for and needed, to see Jesus in the flesh.

That seed and joy and seed the forms since

I was reminded of this painting by Caravaggio on Resurrection Sunday when we prayed the post-communion prayer, "Risen Christ, whom we have seen with our eyes and touched with our hands." I am there with Thomas, inspecting Christ's woundedness. Understanding that these same wounds show me that the Gospel promises are true. I am surprised as I recognise that I, too, am pierced and clutch the wound at my side. But my hand is held, and I feel understood by the one who knows that joy and pain can be present together.

At the heart of our gospel reading this week, John 20: 19-32, is Jesus' generous offer of himself to Thomas. Jesus is meeting Thomas right where he is, with exactly what he needs. Jesus' palpable offer of grace leads Thomas to an understanding that it is Jesus, his Lord and God, right before him. John tells us that Jesus' care for his sheep is equally

without limit and measure for the generations of believers after Thomas.

In a myriad of ways, we are there with Thomas, standing before the risen Christ.

Our trembling hands reaching out, guided by another scarred palm. Being met exactly in all the joy, pain, fear, confusion, excitement and doubt of our lives. Given grace upon grace.

A HELPING HAND

Two weeks ago, M came to St

John's Care. He explained that he was experiencing tough times and was concerned about not being able to pay his bills in time.

M is a young single father of two children (5 y & 2). Although M was reluctant to ask for help because he felt ashamed, but when things got quite tough, he knew he had to reach out for his family's sake.

M said it was near impossible to find work because he cannot afford to pay for the children to be at childcare. He came to St John's Care seeking support with the aim of saving money for the renewal of his car registration. Although M had paid his rent and gas bill the week before, he was left with very little money left over. I offered him a cup of coffee and we sat down and talked, he explained to me what his life was like before becoming a single parent.

M said that it had not been easy, and that it was hard to raise children without assistance, especially when they are young. M is grateful for the things he has; a roof over his head and being able to provide food for his daughters. M explained that with his car registration due, he was concerned that he would be unable to pick up and drop off his daughter from school, purchase winter clothing, winter uniforms or blankets.

SJC immediately supported M with food (fruits, vegetables, meat, bread) and food vouchers for food bank. We also provided him with cozy blankets and referred him to Thread together who assist with clothing. We were able to support M by paying for his registration (3 months) and will continue to support his family by providing

them with food, allowing him to spend money on other expenses.

M could not believe how generous the donors, volunteers and staff at St John's Care were and was very appreciative of the support he had received.

He first came to SJC feeling overwhelmed and hopeless, but after his visit to St John's Care, these feelings suddenly disappeared. He walked away promising that he will do his best for his daughters and feeling much more optimistic about the future.

Nungalinya College Empowering Indigenous Christians

There's lots happening at Nungalinya College. In the last four weeks there have been 85 students attending, studying Music & Media, Art & Faith, Foundation Studies (two classes), Certificate III in Ministry and Theology and a Languages Workshop.



On April 6th the first of a series of Bible Gardens was opened. The series will reflect important narratives from the Scriptures. These gardens will feature symbolic aspects, Indigenous artworks and interactive teaching in First Languages from various Indigenous Elders. The 'Garden of Eden' includes an 'alpha and omega' pathway, trees symbolising the knowledge of good and evil, and the tree of life, over a dozen Indigenous art works and videos on the artists and teaching from Genesis 1-3.


