Everyone at the table?

Every time we take communion, we hear the invitation: "This is the table of the Lord, and all are welcome here." It's easy to take these words for granted.

But how welcoming is the church? How well are we managing to "not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted" (Ps 22:24)? Is the church setting its mind on divine things or are we distracted by human things (Mark 8:33)? What sort of barriers exist in our church, our community and our society that make church and thus Jesus difficult to access?

One of the barriers is 'empire thinking'. That's the type of thinking where we see our church and our way of doing Christianity as 'better' or 'great'. And as a result we miss the times when our church and our ways of being are at best missing ways to demonstrate resilient, restorative, pre-emptive love, and at worst actively discriminating against and disempowering the vulnerable.

There are people in our

communities, and possibly even in our own families desperate to be heard, but are we making ourselves available to listen?

It's not easy to be part of a community when you don't have the right clothes, when your disabilities make you look and sound different, when you don't have transport or don't speak English. It's hard to connect to other people when you don't know the rules of engagement.

How can we remove some of the barriers between people and the church? First, we need to recognise that those barriers exist. And that means talking to those who are currently ignored, harmed and oppressed by our empire thinking.

Today and every day, may we be uncomfortable rather than complacent on our journey of confession, repentance and growth. May we seek ways to listen up and listen in for the voice of Jesus, even if it means we have to change our thinking and being.

Seeking Assistance

Compassion | Advocacy | Respect | Encouragement L had an extremely difficult upbringing - suffering neglect and abuse. This is reflected in certain aspects of her life in adulthood such as some of the parenting choices she has made in the past. L's children have been in care for months and were reunited with her this week.

During the process of getting her children back into her care, L regularly came to St John's Care (SJC) to receive help with food. She told us how losing custody of her children had helped her to improve as a person, and as a mother.

A fortnight ago she told me that her children were coming home permanently, and she needed our help. The first things we put together for her were school supplies including school bags, lunch boxes, drink bottles and stationery. I referred L to Roundabout who helped with toiletries packs for everyone, clothing, a pram, and car seats.

The family are starting a new chapter in their lives and SJC will be supporting them thanks to the help of donors, staff, volunteers, and the wider community. It has been incredible to watch L dedicate herself entirely to ensuring the best possible outcome for her children, and to see some positive and encouraging results.

We'd like to extend our sincerest thanks to our donors for your generous donations. This story reflects how your kindness and empathy impacts the lives of the most vulnerable in our community.

Born in Prague in former Czechoslovakia, Bili escaped with her family to Australia via Austria during the Prague Spring as a child. She completed most of her schooling in Canberra, where she met her husband, Stuart, at High School.

Having worked as a doctor for many years, including fifteen years in the UK with her family, Bili has been involved in ministry both in the United Kingdom and Australia.

She has worked as a hospital Chaplain and a team leader, training others in Chaplaincy. She has led pioneer outreach services and participated in team healing ministries in an Anglican led Wholeness and Healing Centre. Coming from an Islamic background, Bili feels she has a unique perspective

to offer concerning her bi-vocational experience.

Parents of three grown daughters, Bili and her husband live with their dog Oscar and cat Pip. Bili remains active in teaching at the ANU Medical School, where she has chaired a year 3 committee and led clinical skills at Queanbeyan Hospital. She retains admitting rights to Queanbeyan Hospital and has worked in the Emergency Department while caring for elderly patients in nursing homes.

Having completed her MA (Theo), Bili is transitioning into ordained ministry.

Bili will join Holy Covenant's ministry team on 3 March 2024 as a Deacon Assistant Minister. She is being ordained to the Diaconate on Saturday 24 February. Prior to her ordination she was a longterm member of Christ Church Queanbeyan and a lay leader at St Paul's Ginninderra.

Making a home

Settling into a new home takes more than furniture, pots and pans. It takes family, friends and a whole network to help people feel safe and connected.

But what happens if you don't know anyone? Or that all the people who love you are stranded overseas in strange places? Or if you find the expectations around everything from sending your kids to school, driving or even shopping for your favourite foods difficult and weird?

Communities can play an important role helping refugees settle in Australia by providing simple forms of assistance that make a big difference.

In 2022 the Federal Government launched the Community Refugee Integration and Settlement Program as a way for community based groups to support 1,500 refugees start a new life in our strange place. Such programs have proven successful in the UK, US, NZ and Ireland, As an Anglican Community, we can find better ways of working together so that some people can start a new life in our city.
