John 20:19-31 Peace be with you

It is of great significance that the first words spoken by Jesus to his disciples as the risen Lord in John's gospel are Peace be with you! It is in fact a double peace that Jesus brings. First Jesus shows his wounds, the appalling wounds of scourging and crucifixion. Clearly pain and suffering are marked in his body, but are overcome in the new body post death. They are not the last word.

Jesus came to take away fear, most especially the fear of death. This embodies peace: Jesus appears as peace incarnate. He overcomes the negatives: of anxiety, grief, doubt, fear. Most importantly Jesus brings the peace of shalom. This is a word freighted with meaning: peace with God, with ourselves, with our past, with other people and with creation.

It is also noteworthy that the disciples come to believe. Throughout the gospel of John belief is not accepting facts. Rather it is entering into a deep and abiding relationship with Jesus. John employs relationship language to describe his disciples' reaction to the risen Jesus "they rejoiced when they saw the Lord". That relationship was transformatory, with new perceptions of seeing Jesus as he is seen by heaven: Jesus is Lord, with the broken and tragic pieces of history gathered into the glory of God.

The opening verse 19 of this reading describes a group without the Risen Lord. Locked doors, fear shared, without hope. It is a picture with parallels to a church locked off from the world, crouching in fear. His disciples were in fear of the civic and Jewish religious leaders. They had been associated with a convicted insurrectionist, who had been done away with in the national interest. The disciples believed themselves at risk, in danger of their lives, afraid, powerless, directionless. Into this group the reembodied Jesus appears. It is their life moment of epiphany: eyes are opened, hearts empowered, fear transformed into actions grounded in faith. They are our forbears in being open to being empowered and instructed for a new mission as sent ones. Jesus says I am sending you, just as Jesus has himself been sent by the Father. The Holy Spirit is breathed on them, echoing the words of Genesis 2 where God formed humankind from the dust of the ground and breathed life into them, creating living being-in-relationship. Likewise the breath of Jesus is new life from God: inseparable from peace and from being sent. The disciples receive the Spirit of the crucified and risen Jesus, infusing them with the narrative embedded within his life, death and resurrection. The revolution we come to know as

medicine she needed, I asked her if she could come and visit me so that we could talk and look for possible solutions.

M arrived that same afternoon. She has been divorced for several years but was only able to have custody of her daughter this year. M tells me that it has been very difficult for her to deal with the whole situation and she has kept it a secret. She detailed the severe DV she suffered throughout her marriage which is why she opted for divorce but divorce in her culture is seen an imperfection in a supposed perfect, lovely marriage. She reported feeling lonely and only having her daughter to rely on. I provided her with information regarding the following programs available in our community:

- · Health and wellbeing programs
- · Counselling Program
- · Community development
- · Domestic and family violence program
- · Men and Women's outreach workshop (MOW)
- · Emergency Relief
- Young Mentoring Program

I told M that SJC would support her with food, prescriptions (PBS), bus tickets and support in participating in our community Morning Tea/Lunch. We also agreed to go to MARSS to get more information about the Counselling program and Women's outreach workshop. Before leaving, M thanked me for listening to her. She felt very confident in telling me her story, she felt safe and above all free from any kind of harm/shame.

Sometimes it is evident that our clients simply need some human contact to help make them feel secure and happier. Other times just a few minutes to speak and be heard without judgement and be supported by organisations within the community can make all the difference. M was so grateful and had a smile on her face when she left.

The format for the day is as follows:

 8:30am: Venue available for people to sign-in for the first module.

9am -11am: Safe Ministry Essentials (also called Module 1)

11am: Morning Tea (Attendees for the next course can sign-in).

11:30 am-1.30pm: Safe Ministry with Children (also called Module 2)

1.30pm: Lunch (Attendees for next course are able to sign-in)

2pm – 4pm: Safe Ministry Implementation for Senior Leaders (also called Module 3)

Please bring your own lunch.

Tea, coffee etc. provided.

The format of the day allows people to do the module/s they require to volunteer in our many activities.

Having our volunteers complete the relevant training enables our community to be a safe place for everyone. It reminds everyone of the acceptable standards of behaviour and conduct required by volunteers. Furthermore, it enables participants to know how poor conduct might be addressed when it occurs. Poor behaviour and abusive speech are leading causes for withdrawal by effective volunteers.

Education for Ministry (EfM)

EfM is a theological program that enables people to delve deeper into Scripture and to reflect on how tradition and culture shape our life of faith. By working as a group participants are welcome to ask questions and encouraged to think about their often unconscious theological assumptions. It is a deeply transformative experience for all who join in.

Holy Covenant has had a number of EfM groups over the past 20 years. We have also worked closely with Manuka parish and had representatives from a number of other parishes from the north of Canberra as part of our group. If there is anyone in the parish that would be interested in exploring EfM this year or next year could you please contact Merri Bacon?

Merri will see whether it would be possible to form a new group with members of Manuka parish. There need to be sufficient numbers to make a group viable and we would also need to find a mentor and a suitable time. A possible suggested time would be Sunday afternoon.
